I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Mayor J.R. Garza called the regular meeting held on Tuesday June 18, 2024 to order at 6:00 p.m. at the City of Alamo Municipal Building. City Manager Robert L. Salinas led the Pledge of Allegiance and Pastor Tuttle led the Invocation.

C. Presentation and Announcements

City Manager Robert L. Salinas stated the following;

- The City of Alamo offices will be closed June 19th, 2024 in observance for Juneteenth.
- He invited everyone for the Freedom Bash July 3rd, 2024 from 5p.m. to 9p.m.
- He thanked Precint 2 and Commissioner Eddie Cantu for completing the Ridge Rd. project between Tower Rd. and Border Rd.
- Since we are expecting heavy rains, he reminded everyone to stay safe.

Mayor J.R. Garza thanked the Public Works Department as well as the Parks and Recreational Department for their hard work and dedication during this time of possible storm.

Commissioner Pete Morales stated that the City of Alamo is issuing sand bags for the residents. Special assistance for elderly and disabled residents will be provided. The city is providing tickets that can be picked up at City Hall, these tickets will allow city employees to assist the residents in need.

City Manager Robert L. Salinas stated that the sand bag distribution address is 803 S. Tower Rd, 8am to 6:30p.m. today June 18^{th} , 2024. Tomorrow June 19^{th} , 2024 the Public Works Department will be available from 8am to 12pm only.

D. Consideration and Action to Approve the minutes for a regular meeting on June 4th, 2024.

Commissioner Roel Leon Moreno Jr. motioned to approve, Mayor Pro-Tem Okie Salinas seconded. Motion carried.

E. Consideration and Action to approve an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between Hidalgo County and the City of Alamo in order to provide Library Services.

Library Director Jose Tamez stated that on an annual basis the Hidalgo County and the Hidalgo County Library System (HCLS) sign an interlocal agreement in which the 13 municipal libraries agree to provide services to county residents. In turn the county budgets an annual amount to provide to the library system. The funds are first used to pay for the Integrated Library System (ILS) that the 13 libraries use to manage borrowers, the collection, and fines. The remaining amount is then divided equally between the 13 libraries that comprise the HCLS. Each library will be receiving \$14,400.

Commissioner Pete Morales motioned to approve, Mayor Pro-Tem Okie Salinas seconded. Motion carried.

F. Discussion and Possible Action on a request by Eleazar Perez of 111 Becker, being Lot 15, Tower Acres Subdivision, to have their open carport 15 feet from Becker Streets' curb.

Planning Director Sergio Zavala stated that the owner requested that this matter be presented to the City Commission. The Planning Department honored that request. Briefly, the owner hired a contractor to build an open carport where the framing was constructed with no permit, and 2 of its supporting columns are about 4' onto the ROW. Tower Acres has all its streets recorded with 60' ROW. The streets' pavement is 30' B-B which means there is 15' ROW on both sides of the street. The time line on this matter is as follows:

May 31st: Building permit application filed for an open carport at 111 Becker St.

June 3rd: Planning completed review; cited typical min. open carport setbacks.

June 5th: Code Enforcement takes pictures of the completed framing w/no permit.

June 6th: Code Enforcement sends letter to owner to adjust.

June 7th: Planning meets w/applicant; explains options

- 1) to adjust poles,
- 2) ZBA variance process, or
- 3) approach City Commission for self-inflicted matter.

June 11th: Owner requests carport "extend 15 feet instead of 20 feet from the street curb."

Be advised that '15 feet from the street curb' is actually where the front lot line is at; and be advised that '20 feet from the street curb' is the carport's 5' front yard bldg. setback. Staff measured the supporting pole at 11' to the curb (or 4' over their property line).

Their request for the support pole to be "15' from the curb" or on the front lot line, is really a Zoning Board of Adjustments (ZBA) matter -ZBA has been appointed to consider variances within private property. If the pole is on the front lot line, this is within ZBA's realm of delegated authority. Planning provided a variance application and, when asked if they were going to file, they replied that they wanted this matter presented to the City Commission

Planning's Recommendation: no action; the 15' from curb is a ZBA

Resident Eleazar Perez presented himself and stated that his vehicle cannot be parked to close to the house because he has a special need child who requires to use a wheelchair and in doing so, they need enough space to maneuver the wheel chair.

Mayor J.R. Garza stated that the Commission as well as the City of Alamo is here to help.

Planning Director Sergio Zavala stated that he will be able to go on site (111 Becker St) to explain and give them the options available.

City Engineer Ronnie Cruz presented the following

- Duranta Avenue and 13th Street Drainage Improvements. Timeline;
 - July 6, 2022 Cruz-Hogan Consultants, Inc. drafted a letter to City Manager Mr. Salinas to confirm that the City is persuing funding through the Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funded by the General Land Office (GLO).

- August 11, 2022 Executed Agreement for Engineering Services with the City of Alamo
- o February 13, 2023 Construction documents were completed and submitted to Grant Works on October of 2023
- October 24, 2023 Amendment No. 1 (to make Alamo 2018 Floods Engineering Contract complaint with GLO regulations).
- February 15, 2023 The City of Alamo was motified of the Grant Award. The Grant Award is as follows: Grant Award: \$973,285.00

City Match: \$9,831.00

o Pending final approval of Environmental Review.

Commissioner Pete Morales asked if this drainage project will help alleviate the water from Date Palm, Royal Palm and Sabal Palm.

City Engineer Ronnie Cruz stated that this new project will help alleviate all that area.

Commissioner AJ Garcia summarized that the General Land Office (GLO) is providing funding for a drainage project to address the longstanding flooding issues on Duranta Avenue. This project is expected to have a significant impact on the City of Alamo. To proceed and start the bidding process, we are currently awaiting the release of an environmental report, which is anticipated within the next 30 days.

- Alamo Road Drainage Improvement Project (Duranta Ave. to expressway I-2)
 - Several meetings with TxDOT officials on drainage issues on Duranta Ave. to Expressway I-2
 - o TxDOT committed to the City of Alamo that they will find the construction of the project. The City committed to Engineering and Hydrology & Hydraulics Study. The preliminary cost estimate for construction \$793,753.00
 - April 04, 2024 Executed Agreement for Engineering Contract for the project and Hydrology & Hydraulics Study.
 - o June of 2024 sunmitted Final Layout of project for TxDot approval. Final Hydrology & Hydraulics Study also submitted for approval.

Commissioner AJ Garcia summarized that there is a drainage project for Alamo Road in collaboration with TxDOT, which has received an H&H report and is now awaiting TxDOT's approval.

Mayor J.R. Garza asked about the timeframe for this project.

City Engineer Ronnie Cruz answered that hopefully before next rainy season.
