• PUBLIC COMMENT

• Resident Sandra Copson stated her concerns about the recent flooding in her subdivision, which she believes is due to the adjacent subdivision that was built called "Aqui Descanso" Now they are also dealing with mold due to the water that went inside her home. She mentioned meeting with the city engineer and several representatives from the City of Alamo to address the situation. However, she is still waiting for a response or update. With hurricane season approaching, she and her neighbors are anxious about the possibility of more flooding and its consequences.

II CONSENT AGENDA

All consent agenda items are considered routine by the City Commission and will be enacted by one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a Councilmember requests an item be removed and considered separately. The City Commission May Take Various Actions; Included But Not Limited To Rescheduling An Item In Its Entirety For A Future Date Or Time. current contract expires.

7. Consideration and Action to Approve a contract between the City of Alamo and Memorial Funeral Home.

Commissioner Okie Salinas asked a question in reference to Item #6, is this the same contractor we are dealing with the replacements of the street lights on Duranta Avenue and Tower Road?

City Manager Robert L. Salinas responded that Engine is the retail provider for the city. Basicilly they are our electric provider.

Valiant Energy Consultant Juan Galvan apologized for the delay in repairing the street lighting. Unfortuneatly, some unforseen circumstances caused the setback, but the team is already working on it. He further explained the electric contract and the benefits of a fixed rate for this year. This way, when the contract ends, they'll have the option to renew at the locked-in rate, rather than facing potentially higher prices in the future.

Commissioner Okie Salinas motioned to approve Consent Agenda Items 1-7; Mayor Pro-Tem Roel Leon Moreno Jr. seconded. Motion carried.

II. Regular Agenda

D. Consideration and Action to Approve a Proclamation Declaring April 2025 as Fair Housing Month.

Mayor J.R. Garza read the Fair Housing Month Proclamation.

Mayor Pro-Tem Roel Leon Moreno Jr. motioned to approve, Commissioner Pete Morales seconded. Motion carried.

E. Consideration and Possible Action to award a bid for Janitorial Services.

Purchasing Agent Adela Perez stated that the city solicited sealed bids for Janitorial Services. The solicitation for services were advertised on March 12th & 19th with bid opening on April 3rd, 2025. The current contract includes an option to extend the existing agreement or renew it for an additional two-years. 5 Bids were received and reviewed by staff with the specifications outlined in the bid documents. Based on the evaluation, it is recommended that the contract be awarded to C&C Cleaning & Janitorial Services for the bid amount of \$38,400.00. Staff's recommendation: Approve award to C&C Cleaning & Janitorial Services. This item is now before you.

Commissioner Okie Salinas asked if the awarded bid can be for 3 years instead of 2?

City Manager Robert L. Salinas responded that it is a 2 year contract with an option to extend one additional year

Commissioner Okie Salinas motioned to approve for 3 years, Mayor Pro-Tem Roel Leon Moreno Jr. seconded. Motion carried.

F. Consideration and Action to Select an Architect for the City of Alamo Remodel/Reconstruction of Fire Station No. 2.

CityManager Robert L. Salinas stated that the City of Alamo advertised RFQs for architectural services for the remodeling of Fire Station No. 2. The qualifications wew received, reviewed and graded by City Staff. Staff used various criteria in determining the scores of the firms, including Overall Qualifications, project Specific Expertise, Management & Organizational Approach etc. Recommendation: Staff recommends the selection of Gignac Architects to serve as the architect for the Fire Station No. 2 remodeling project. This item is now before you.

Commissioner Okie Salinas motioned to approve Gignac Architects, Mayor Pro-Tem Roel Leon Moreno Jr. seconded. Motion carried.

G. Consideration and Action to Select an Architect for the City of Alamo Remodel/Reconstruction of City Hall Annex Building.

City Manager Robert L. Salinas stated that the City of Alamo requested RFQs for architectural services for the remodeling of what we are calling the City Hall Annex Building, which is where the old museum was located. The qualifications were received, reviewed and graded by City staff. Staff used various criteria in determining the scores of the firms, including Overall Qualification, project Specific Expertise, Mangement & Organizational Approach, etc. Recommendation; the scoring revealed a 3-way tie between ERO, GIGNAC, and SAM GARCIA. Due to the tie, Staff recommends Sam Garcia Architects, since we've never used them before and so that we can get an idea of the work they perform. If we cannot come to an agreement on fees, we can always go with the other firms. This item is now before you.

Mayor J.R.Garza moptioned to approve staff's recommendation, Commissioner Pete Morales seconded. Motion carried.

H. Discussion and Possible Action on an Ordinance for Traffic Control Signage and Street Markings on Crockett Avenue, East of Tower Road as induced by Four (4) Neighborhoods Petitioning through Neighborhood Representative Irene Vasquez.

Planning Director Sergio Zavala stated that Staff received several petitions to manifest their collective traffic safety concerns on Crockett, east of Tower Road. The primary issue relates to speeding traffic, and how to slow-down/calm the traffic on Crockett. Their request is for the City to carefully assess these concerns, and then hopefully provide additional traffic control signage and/or markings on Crockett. The petitioners have expressed concerns of speeding traffic on Crockett. The petitions included several exhibits that project their concerns; including:

Exhibit A & B-APO Press/News releases reflecting a major accident at Crockett and Serg Loop; injuries; death eventually occurred from injuries; Jan. 16+, 2025

Exibit C-Alamo's website screen shot of the City of Alamo participating to link-up to a hike & bike trail (that will be parallel to Crockett).

Exhibit D-Part of the Hike & Bike trail is along Crockett

Exhibit E-Master aerial overview of vicinity; petitioners request 4 'Stop' signs at 2 intersections; suggests 4 'Slow Down' signs.

Exhibit F-Zoomed-in focus on Crockett/Serg Loop; 2 'Stop' signs

and 'Slow Down' signage that was shown in Master Aerial.

Exhibit G-Zoomed-in focus on Crockett/S. 4th St.; 2 'Stop' signs requested; the Master Aerial also showed 2 'Slow Down' signs.

Exhibit H-Zoomed-in focus on Crockett (between S. 4th & Palmview Dr.);

Essentially shows the same requested signage as in "G'.

Exhibit I-Shows lane-directional arrows suggested to be painted;

Shows 4 existing 'Stop' signs.

Resident Irene Vasquez and Pita Castillo stated that Justin Julian Rodriguez who passed away on January 21st, 2025 due to an accident in the area motivated them to advocate for this neighborhood. They voiced there concerns.

Commissioner Okie Salinas thanked Ms. Vasquez and Ms. Castillo for coming forward and bringing these concerns to the City Commission.

Commissioner Okie Salinas motioned to approve, Commissioner Pete Morales seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Pete Morales mentioned that on the intersection of Tower Rd. and Crockett there is a great need of traffic control/ traffic light.

Planning Director stated that in the next Traffic Safety Committee meeting they will discuss this issue and address it as well.

Commissioner AJ Garcia asked what is the threshold requirement for a traffic light?

Planning Director Sergio Zavala responded that he is unsure since it is not a TxDot road. TxDot

roads have their own rules but since this is a city road there is a lot to consider. For example accidents, pedestrian and just over all traffic. One main factor that has to be looked at is the cost and maintenance of the traffic light.

Commissioner AJ Garcia stated that safety does not have a price and that the City Commission will look into it.

Planning Director Sergio Zavala suggested to study the issues in that intersection and come back with a recommendation for the City Commission to review and mmake a decision.

Mayor Pro-Tem Roel Leon Moreno Jr. thanked once again Ms. Vasquez and Ms. Castillo for raising their concerns, for making Alamo a safe and better city.

Commissioner Pete Morales stated that the City Commission is here to listen to the residents concerns. He encouraged them to feel comfortable in expressing their concerns to the City Commission.

I. <u>TABLED</u>: Discussion and Possible Action to Appoint, or Re-appoint, Five (5) members to the City of Alamo's Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone No. 1's Board of Directors.

Commissioner AJ Garcia motioned to untable item I, Mayor J.R. Garza seconded. Motion carried.

Planning Director Sergio Zavala stated that term for the TIRZ members have expired and it is time to re-appoint or appoint members once more.

Commissioner AJ Garcia asked if any of the members were present.

Planning Director Sergio Zavala responded no.

Commissioner AJ Garcia when was the last time that this board met and what was discussed?

Planning Director Sergio Zavala answered that they meet once a year, or as needed and he does not recall what was discussed in that meeting.

Further comments were discussed.

Mayor Pro- Tem Roel Leon Moreno Jr. motioned to appoint Emigdio Villanueva, Commissioner Pete Morales motioned to appoint Mayra Benedetti, Commissioner Okie Salinas motioned to reappoint Keith Hakland, Commissioner AJ Garcia motioned to re-appoint David Suarez, Mayor J.R. Garza motioned to appoint Asael Alanis, Commissioner Pete Morales seconded. Motion carried.

J. <u>TABLED</u>: Discussion and Possible Action to Re-Amend Title 10's 'Zoning Regulations' to include "Business Recycling Facility" as a conditional use in the Commercial and Industrial zoning districts with correlating compliance criteria thereby.

Commissioner Okie Salinas motioned to untable item J, Commissioner Pete Morales seconded. Motion carried,

Planning Director Sergio Zavala stated that due to a visit on 3-24-25 by a prospective business entrepreneur asking about a recycling facility, Planning discovered that the approved merits of Business Recycling Facility Ordinance No. 10-02-22 had not been fully codified. (Note: Since 2022, 'Vendors Market' has been enumerated as 'Conditional Use Criteria #7' in our CUP regs; thus, the attached ordinance reflects the Business Recycling Facility regs to be #8 ... the 2022 Ordinance cited above showed the 'Business Recycling Facility' to have been #7; but since not codified, this will need to be shifted to #8.) In review of the 2-1-2022 City Commission minutes, Planning observed the City Commission's desire to establish a 300' distance from the specific recycling activity building to area residences - the original 2022 draft cited 200'. Since the motion for approval did not specifically include 'subject to the 300' distance, as discussed, the ordinance was approved as originally proposed (w/the 200' distance). Planning would like to rectify this. With this backdrop, be advised that the attached ordinance:

- Specifies a 300' distance that the recycling activity must be to area residences
- Categorizes the 'Business Recycling Facility'to be a conditional use in the Industrial zone; the Codifier only showed a 'Business Recycling Facility' being a conditional use in the Commercial Zone, but not in the Industrial zone, as specified in approved Ord. 10-02-22.
- Via discussion on 4-1-25, any new Business Recycling Facility via a CUP is prohibited along the Commercial Corridor (NOT along the major streets).

Commissioner Pete Morales motioned to approve, Mayor J.R. Garza seconded. Motion carried.

K. Consideration and Action to award a bid for NFC Fitness Courts slabs (Lion's Park & Alaniz-Villagomez Park).

AEDC Consultant Isauro Trevino stated that the three bids received were based on identical specifications, which had been emailed to each bidder, ensuring all parties had the same scope of work. Three bids were received which are as follows;

- 1. S. Lerma Construction LLC \$24,900.00
- 2. Tex Con & Maint. LLC \$37,995.00
- 3. ECON Construction \$38,800.00

Staff's recommendation is to award bid to S. Lerma Construction LLC.

Commissioner AJ Garcia motioned to approve, Commissioner Okie Salinas seconded. Motion carried.

L. Consideration and Action to Approve Change Order No. 6 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Project.

Commissioner Okie Salinas stated that he has some legal questions for the City Attorney, Cris Palacios in regards to items L.
