I. Call meeting to order

Mayor J.R. Garza called the special meeting held on Thursday, July 31st, 2025 to order at 6:00 p.m. at the City of Alamo Municipal Building. Assistant City Manager Alexandra Rangel led the Pledge of Allegiance and AEDC Consultant Isauro Treviño led the Invocation.

- II. Discuss, Consider and Adopt a Resolution Authorizing Submission of the Disaster Recovery Reallocation Program (DRRP) Application (DRRP-102-1006) Administered Through the Texas General Land Office for the City of Alamo.

Assistant City Manager Alexandra Rangel gave a brief background. The General Land Office (GLO) reallocated millions of dollars from previous grants into the Disaster Recovery Reallocation Program which is the DRRP grant. These project have a max cap of 2 million. Back on January 7th, 2025 the City of Alamo was selected. Both Grant Works and Cruz Hogan to administer the grant and provide engineering services for the DRRP grant. However the City of Alamo was not originally selected. Then on June 16th we were invited to apply for the funding and what is being called round two. The project we are proposing is what we are calling phase three of the Alamo and Durante Drainage Project. This project will provide adjoining lines in the area between the Alamo Road and to the Alamo drain ditch. Since it has a cap of 2 million, we are hoping that we are able to complete this project with the funds being provided. According to the purpose resolution, it is to authorize the submittle of the DRRP allocation to the GLO and authorizing the Mayor and City Manager as the designated chief executive officers, as well as authorizing a contribution of 200,000 thousands dollars match towards the project. Staff is

recommending approval.

Commissioner Okie Salinas asked if they had any drawing of what they need?

City Engineer Ronnie Cruz responded no, what they need to update is the cost estimate.

Further comments and concerns were addressed.
